Starts Jan 1, 2013

Awarded by MPFA Board of Directors at December board meeting

Requirements:

AMPLIFICATION Candidates

must:

Have fished 10 or more waters during the calendar year (no private pay to play waters) *This means that the general public have unrestricted access at all times, without any special fees to the waters fished*

Waters may be tributaries of any river or lakes domestic or international *Meaning any named stream, river, or section of river (As in Upper Sacramento R. or Lower Sacramento R. - would be two waters) in any country.*

Used fly fishing tackle only *Simply that!*

Have fished for trout (This is a Trout Bum Award) *Simply that!*
The award generally will go to the person who fly fished for trout in the most public waters

Have reported to the club and shown photos to the club at a regular meeting
Reporting means informing the membership-simple as that - Does not mean that the person must give a slide show presentation, just tell the club where you fished, how you did, what you used - show some pictures.
The purpose of the award is to encourage members to explore, fish as many new waters as they can, tell the membership about the experience there-fore encouraging others to do likewise.

Veterans First Fly Fishing

One of the most fun parts of a great trip is in the telling of it!

Working with the veterans through ***Veterans First Fly Fishing*** is both a privilege and a rewarding experience:

The *privilege* is having the chance to be with these courageous young people who have gone through an unimaginable hell, and now are trying to put their life back together.

The *reward* is watching them learn how to relax and enjoy the simple pleasures we call fly fishing.

The December 8th 2012 Benefit Dinner yielded the funding that now is allowing us to take trips such as the February trip to the Red Bluff area's **Eagle Canyon Trophy Trout Lakes**, these lakes are stocked with 4lb to 15lb Rainbow trout! Think about that, if a fish takes the fly it is going to be at least a 4lb fish. Most fly fishermen never, & I mean never have had a 4lb fish take their fly.

On Saturday Feb. 2nd we took five (5) veterans to **Eagle Canyon Trophy Trout Lakes** some of the were from a residency treatment program at Menlo Park VA. These veterans have been participating in the **VFFF** workshops that are held every other Friday. These veterans did not simply say "oh yeah, I'll go on the trip!". They had to prepare a proposal, state what they wanted to do, what benefit it was going to be for them, when they were going to leave and when they would be returning. Then present that proposal to their peers in what is termed the "Community" for approval.

I went to their "Community" meeting on the Tuesday after we returned, and spoke to them about how well these veterans did, and how impressed the volunteers were with their behavior, and how much we enjoyed their company. The therapist & staff at the VA told me that the participants could not hold back the joy and appreciation they had for the trip.

The quote of the day was heard at Dinner that night:

"In my entire life, I never have had so much fun while sober!"

Think about that! If this small act of ours changes the course of that veterans life – can it get any better?

Members – Regarding fish-outs:

We are going to try something a little different to try and get more of the club members fishing together.

Rather than a “planned” event where the fish-master makes arrangements, we would like to encourage those of you who are planning a close trip (1 day) and would like some extra company to write up a quick description and send out an email to the members.

This would be a trip you are already going on and one in which you may already have one or more fishing partners going with you. Since these are more impromptu than an organized outing, the advance warning could be brief, as little as 24 hours notice.

Anybody seeing the email would know that somebody they know would be fishing that spot and has experience in that area. They would also have a list of the recommended equipment and the expected conditions. These will not be “guided” trips and everybody going should expect to be pretty much on their own, providing their own transportation and all of their own equipment, etc.

The advantages are that you will know somebody who has been there and would probably get some assistance on techniques, etc. and you would learn of new places to fish.

Here’s what would be needed to be included in the trip announcement:

- Your name and those already going with you.
- The location.
- The time and date you will be there.
- The fish species you are going for.
- The expected conditions (wading, steep terrain, flotation equipment required, etc)
- The equipment you recommend: Rod, Line(s), Flies, waders or float tubes, etc.

Club members would set up a file in their e-mail program that would contain all the club members e-mail addresses. The club would send out the list, of addresses, to the members to place in this e-mail file. A member would select this address file, include all the information above and send it to the group. Anyone available and interested in going would then have a chance to decide if they wanted to participate.
